To Whom It May Concern,

I am contacting you in relation to a request from one of our grantees, NUR Foundation, to provide a reference letter. I can confirm that NUR Foundation has received an AmplifyChange Strengthening Grant for their project entitled “Effectiveness of Teachers and Health Care Providers in Improving Knowledge Attitude and Practices of Adolescents” in Pakistan, which commenced on 15 April 2019 and concluded on 15 July 2021. The total value of the grant was €99430. NUR Foundation went through a competitive selection process and were successful when their application competed with other applicants through an independent review process based on relevance of the application, strategic fit, added value of the application and capacity of the group to implement the proposed project. They successfully went through due diligence and fiduciary risk management processes to determine their risk level and provide strengthening measures to mitigate any risks.

Through this project, Nur Foundation have produced and delivered culturally sensitive and appropriate life skills education in both classroom and digital settings. They produce tangible evidence that continues to contribute towards the need for integrated LSBE in the curriculum, and advocate for its continued inclusion with key stakeholders. Their performance has been exemplary throughout the project duration.

AmplifyChange is a fund that aims to empower young people, men and women to realise their sexual and reproductive rights in countries where the needs are greatest, in particular Sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia. AmplifyChange is a pooled fund supported by: Danida at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Denmark; the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands; the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation; UK aid, the UK’s Department for International Development; The Norwegian Agency of Development Cooperation; Viiv Healthcare’s Positive Action for Women and Girls; the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency in collaboration with RFSU; and an anonymous donor. The donors have contracted a consortium to deliver AmplifyChange, made up of three partners: Mannion Daniels Limited, Global Fund for Women (GFW) and the African Women Development Fund (AWDF).
